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From the Principal:

Dear Parents and community,

As a parent, you are your child's first and most important teacher. When parents and families are involved in their children's school, the children do better and have better feelings about going to school. In fact, many studies show that what the family does is more important to a child's school success than how much money the family makes or how much education the parents have. There are many ways that parents can support their children's learning at home and throughout the school year.

Here are some ways to be involved. Meet with your child's teacher regularly either by coming to the school or keeping in touch with your child's teacher by email or phone calls. Attend parent / teacher conferences at the end of each semester. Let your child know that you think education is important and that homework needs to be done each day. You can help your child with homework by setting aside a special place to study, establishing a regular time for homework, and removing distractions such as the television and social phone calls during homework time. Additionally, if something concerns you about your child's learning or behavior, ask the teacher or principal about it and seek their advice.

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Reading with your child is vital. Research shows that it's the single most important thing you can do to help your child's education. It's best to read in short sessions and often so try to put aside some time for it every day. As with reading, try to make maths as much fun as possible - games, puzzles and jigsaws are a great way to start. It's also important to show how we use maths skills in our everyday lives and to involve your child in this.
