We continue to make class visits to all bilingual classes. We have focused on building five lessons from Year 1 to Year 5 on oriented social construct. The teaching activities are organized with vivid colors to create the understanding, in accordance with the characteristics of the age of the students.

With the subtle use of teaching methods of some teachers in some classes, students are talking more, do more and are engaged to experience many different activities. They have used their prior knowledge in order to develop new knowledge and learning content. Students also have the opportunity to self-assess their learning through the comments, evaluation of teachers and classmates, in the spirit of innovation assessing primary students of Ministry of Education and Training created.
