Year 6L

Year 6 International is a diverse group of students and unique in their own way. They are currently preparing themselves to be fully equipped not just with skills and knowledge but also the virtues that they need to carry with them through their secondary school journey. The class teacher, Ms. Melody from the Philippines, provides students with a conducive learning environment where diversity, self-esteem and respect are honored. Ms. Melody sets goals which encourage students to take an active role in their learning experiences. She encouragesstudents to develop personal goal-setting and flexible thinking that will be valuable skills throughout their lives. Year 6L students come from Vietnam, Singapore, Taiwan and Korea and one student has been joining the class from California USA online. Despite the time zone differences and challenges of online learning the student in California (Le Anh Minh) was Year 6L's Student of the Month in February. Bullying, teasing and other put-down behavior are never tolerated in Year 6L as Ms Melody allows time for students to learn about each other and gain an appreciation and respect for the diversity they bring to each other's lives and the classroom.

Experimenting and exploring together, especially in Science class, is a feature of Year 6L's classroom. Students enjoy individual and group projects, e.g. experimenting with electric circuits, techniques in separating substances, and STEM projects where they invented their own hand washing device with the goal of finding a way to help people be safe from Corona Virus infection. Students also get involved in making PowerPoint presentations even doing presentations about grammar rules for English! Year 6L is an active class and enjoy having a voice and an audience; it's part of transitioning from Primary School to Middle (Secondary) School. They produced an excellent debate on Blood Donation raising ethical and moral issues that revealed a truly altruistic and worldly view of current affairs. In Math, Year 6L work with Mr Paul as their teacher who acts as a specialist teacher and provides the class with a taste of Middle (Secondary) school where they will have different teachers for all of their subjects. Mr Paul has been focusing on learning unique ways on how to do problem solving. Learning the Singapore method for solving problems is quite challenging and students feel extremely happy when they solve problems on their own. As a rehearsal for Middle (Secondary) school, Year 6L have adapted very well to multiple teachers but have retained the personal level of focused care and attention in having a dedicated homeroom teacher in Ms Melody.









Ms Melody says, "Talking to my students and playing with them during break time has a big impact on their overall development and learning process as young adults. The students should feel that they are loved and respected and be confident to speak up in class."

It was Year 6L's turn to participate in OBV (Outward Bound Vietnam) which was held at our school campus due to COVID-19 disruptions. That was so much fun with sleeping overnight and all the outdoor adventures; Ms Melody was there too and was careful to keep everyone in check.

It has been a tough year for 6L with so many disruptions and challenges thrown at them by COVID-19. Yet, their journey with Ms. Melody, Mr Paul and Ms Hong (TA) has been blissful, and their teachers are all very proud of the way they have matured, grown and positioned themselves as global citizens and academic



achievers of the future.

Ms Melody says, "To all the challenges that you may face in this remaining Year 6 journey, always remember that we are companions and that we can get through it all as ONE!"
