Badminton court and Basketball court



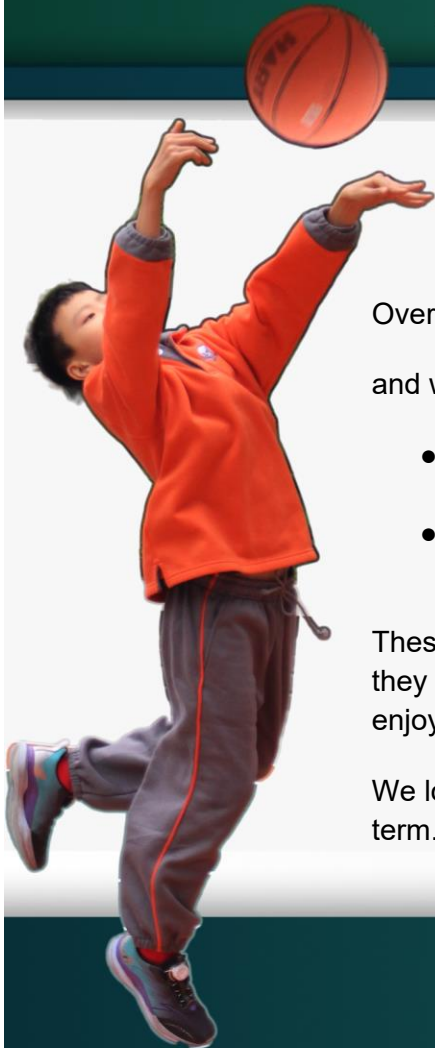
Campus upgrade, new sports courts in our front yard
