
Dear Community,


In HPE we Learn to Move and Move to Learn (despite the pandemic) by Mr. Modie










## Learning with Ms. Sang in Classroom 1A


Class 1A Integrated is a class of 12 very lovely students. From the beginning of the school year, the form teacher has aimed to flexibly use applications such as Quizizz, Kahoot, and Forms to build excitement in each lesson.

In math lessons, the children have the opportunity to explore many ways to add and subtract numbers within 100. If looking for guidance, any students of class 1A can confidently guide other

classmate with their learning tasks. Therefore, each math lesson goes by smoothly when the children know how to support each other.



In story-telling lessons, students were extremely fond of role-playing and retelling the story in front of the class. The children embody their role, flexibly using familiar toys at home as props. From there, the children practice their memory and creativity in narrating a story and confidently present it in front of the whole class. Comments are also being made after each presentation to encourage each other.
