### From the Principal:

Dear Parents and community,

Welcome to the October issue of the Singapore International School newsletter. Each month we send important information to you in letters, emails and the monthly newsletter. I encourage you to read each letter or email to understand and to be updated on events and key elements that affect your child.

It was a pleasure seeing each of you during the recent Parent/Teacher interviews. As stated many times when parents are involved in their child's education children make better grades, enjoy school more, behavior problems are lower and the student feels self-worth.

To keep you updated I would like to provide you with a few ways we work and assess your children's academic growth. We use a varied array of assessments at SIS@Ciputra. One of those assessments is formal assessments. Formal assessments are typically used as a standardized measurement of student progress. Teachers use the end-of-unit tests after each class has finished a section in the textbook. Formal assessments are typically multiple choice exams, though short answer questions and essays may be included in some instances.

Additionally, we keep portfolios on each student. Portfolios track a student's learning over time, often throughout the entire school year. Portfolio assessments focus on long-term learning gains and allow teachers to see how a child has made progress throughout the year. Portfolio assessments often include rough drafts and final works, graphic organizers, classroom assignments and student reflections.

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Here at SIS@Ciputra we have very high expectations for all of our students. According to the Association of Colleges and Universities, raising expectations can lead to higher achievement, and numerous studies show that students with high expectations perform at a higher level than those with low expectations, even when their abilities are equal. High expectations can even transform a student's belief and behaviour and turn a low-performing student into a successful learner.

Several factors can project higher expectations to students. First, we create an environment conducive to learning in our classroom. Increase the input we give to students, because expending more time and effort shows that you expect more. Finally, we encourage students to give responses and increased output; students will do the work you expect them to do if they feel you support them.



#### Teacher Professional Development:

In the current workplace environment, teachers are finding themselves faced with stressful situations. There are deadlines, professional development requirements, and performance reviews, among other things.

Successful teachers must have a strong knowledge and understanding of the subject material that they are teaching their students. Teacher professional development works to strengthen teachers' perceptions on how students learn and process the information that they are being exposed to and tested on. Additionally, teachers will be able to practice new strategies that they will later implement into their classroom environments, such as cooperative learning and role playing. Due to the incorporation of various teaching methods, students are likely to perform at much higher rates and both students and teachers will benefit from greater achievement.

During the month of October teachers participated in weekly professional developments on Wednesday afternoons. One professional development given was Guided Language Acquisitions and Designs G.L.A.D. This Professional Development was presented by Mr. Shawn Standiford. Using this modality teachers instruct students on inquiry methods of learning. This helps them to think, predict and hypothesize and address misconceptions. Additionally, it increases vocabulary and concepts, encourages brain imprinting and organizes information.
